Reading at home

At School we are pushing hard on reading and writing. All students receive a book to take home with them to read. One of the most beneficial activities you can do to support their learning and development is by reading with them everyday at home. It not only helps improve their literacy skills but also fosters a love for reading and learning. Make it a routine, set aside a specific time each day for reading together. Consistency is key to forming habits, and regular reading sessions will reinforce the importance of literacy in your child's life.

Weekly sports lessons

All students at Tāmaki receive a 45 minute PE lesson where they learn different sport skills. This term students have been focusing on soccer skills.







Dental Van

As part of regular dental checkups for students, the Dental Van will be on site at the beginning of T3 to assess dental hygiene of all students. The Auckland Regional Dental Service (ARDS) is a Te Whatu Ora-operated service, which provides FREE dental care to children across greater Auckland. In order to prevent any eligible children missing out on receiving free dental care, ARDS is cross-checking their own records with school rolls.
