Kia Kaha Te Reo Māori

This week Tāmaki Primary School celebrated Te Wiki o te Reo Māori, with performances, pūrākau, kēmu and a hui-a-kura led by Kōkā Anahera and Year 8 student Shaiann. Te Wiki o te Reo Māori has grown to become a revitalisation movement. It has moved from one day a year, to a week... and now there is a growing movement to make every day a Māori language day.

Tāmaki Primary School has a Rumaki Reo Unit Te Puna Wairua, led by our Pou Matua Whaea Lee-Ann Tutengaehe. Te Puna Wairua is a Level 1 (81-100%) Rumaki Reo, where learning is delivered mostly in Te Reo Māori with very minimal English for ākonga in Years 1-8.
