Attendance

Attendance is a Government priority for 2025. The attendance goal is supported by a comprehensive attendance action plan that includes making school and learning so much fun that your amazing kids want to be here every day. It also involves following up on all unexplained





absences, every single day. You will be familiar with Mrs Sharon Williamson's text messages and phone calls every morning. In addition, our new Attendance Connector Matua Bismarck Leota will be door-knocking with me, to see what barriers to attendance can be removed, so that our children can attend school regularly. Two or more unexplained absences in a term are automatically referred to the Auckland City Education Service truancy team.

If your child is absent from school for any reason, please phone 0800 527634 and leave a message before 9:00 am daily. This will help us to focus on following up on unexplained absences.

Curriculum

Curriculum, assessment and achievement is another Government priority for 2025. This year we will continue implementing Rangaranga reo ā-tā in Te Puna Wairua Tau 1-8, and we are starting with the Better Start Literacy Approach in Year 1-3, and Structured Literacy in Years 4-8. We will be running whānau workshops throughout the year to support parents to see how our new approach to learning literacy and te reo matatini can be supported at home.

Relationships

This year, we continue to foster full immersion and bilingual education,

which is integral to our community vision and the culture of our school. Te Puna Wairua, our Year 1-8 Rumaki Reo is led by Pouārahi Rumaki Whaea Lee-Ann Tutengaehe with kaiako Anahera-Pono Tutengaehe. Talamuka-'a-Tonga, our Year 1-8 Lea-Fakatonga bilingual class, is led by Mrs Luti Tafea with Mrs Archana Sharma. Our newest dual language class, Penina o Tāmaki, is a Year 1-6 Gagana



Samoa bilingual class led by Mrs Mile Afoa-Leiataua. Tāmaki School is committed to Rumaki Reo, Bilingual Tongan, Bilingual Sāmoan and culturally responsive English Medium education for our community. We are taking new enrolments for these special character classes now. You do not need to live "in-zone" to enrol in these classes at Tāmaki Primary School.

Sports

Matua Bismarck Leota is also the new Sports Coordinator at Tāmaki Primary School. This term, our sports are Rippa Rugby, Under 12s Tackle Rugby and Volleyball. We have Tackle training every Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning at 8:30 am. We want to take an Under 12s Open team to play Saturday rugby for Marist this season, and will start collecting registrations mid-March. We will register as a team through the school. We will be hosting friendly games with local schools, and playing the curtain-raiser for the Marist Premiers opening game for the season, too.

The Tāmaki Cluster Volleyball tournament is our next sports event, on Wednesday 9 April 2025 at the Bruce Pulman Sports Centre in Takanini. There will be two teams: Years 5&6, and Years 7&8. One of the criteria for selection for the team is regular attendance, that is, attending school more than 90% of the time.
